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AGREEMENT

Between The Retail Meat Dealers and Local Union No. 559

Of Bloomington, Ill

Amalgamated Meat Cutters and Butchers Workmen of North America,

Affiliated with The American Federation of Labor

ARTICLE 1.—The Union Market Card is the property of the Union and is loaned to the Market as long as the terms of this agreement are not violated. The Card shall be placed in the Market where it will be conveniently seen and shall not leave the Market except by request of a properly authorized agent of Local Union No. 559, who must have a written order, properly signed by the Officers of Local Union No. 559.

ARTICLE 2.—All Meat Cutters and Sausage Makers must be members of "The Amalgamated Meat Cutters and Butchers Workmen of North America, A. F. of L.

ARTICLE 3.—When in need of help, the employer may hire a meat cutter or apprentice, providing said meat cutter or apprentice is willing to file application for membership in Local Union No. 559 of Bloomington, Ill., not later than six (6) days after date of employment.

ARTICLE 4.—Markets shall not open before 7:00 A. M. and shall close at 6:00 P. M. on all days except Saturday; when the hours shall be from 7:00 A. M. until 9:00 P. M. Markets shall be closed on *Sundays, Decoration Day, July Fourth, Labor Day, Thanksgiving, Christmas and New Years.*

ARTICLE 5.—Members shall receive no less than \$30.00 per week as a minimum wage. Extra men shall receive \$5.00 per day and \$6.50 for Saturday, when employed.

Apprentices; shall receive not less than \$17.50 per week for the first year; \$20.00 per week the second year and \$22.50 per week the third year. One apprentice shall be allowed to each shop where a member is employed.

No member receiving more than the amounts herein provided shall have their wages reduced.

ARTICLE 6.—Employers shall furnish Laundry.

ARTICLE 7.—Members working in Union Markets must be ready to quit at the time designated but must wait upon all persons present at the closing hour.

Markets must be clean and in a sanitary condition before leaving.

ARTICLE 8.—This agreement shall be binding and in force from June 15th, 1939 to June 15th, 1940, and may be reconstructed on Four (4) Weeks' notice, given by either party, of a desire to make a change in above contract "at expiration."
